Professor Bradshaw's research focuses on the ways that ancient Greek philosophy has shaped medieval philosophy and religious thought, and how these, in turn, have contributed to the formation of modernity. It explores the philosophical roots of the division between the Greek-speaking (Eastern) and Latin-speaking (Western) branches of Christianity, particularly with respect to the concept of the divine energies, and that of God as pure act. It also examines the issues of divine freedom, time and eternity, the nature of the will, and free will and predestination.
