

Theme

In this series of talks, we hope to recover some of the wisdom of the early Christian Church regarding the sacredness of marriage. Many early Fathers of the Church discerned the love between husband and wife as an image of divine love. They saw marriage first and foremost in a very positive way, namely, as a school where one could learn to 'live' the love of God. In this way, marriage was understood as a pathway leading towards God's heavenly kingdom enabling spouses to become joint "heirs of the gracious gift of life" (1Peter 3:7).

In light of all that we are witnessing today with regards to the desacralisation of marriage, it becomes all the more important to become better acquainted with our Church's teaching on the sacredness of marriage, doing so in such a way, however, which is not constricted, intolerant and authoritarian.
