COURSE OUTCOMES

The Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies is designed for those who hold a three-year undergraduate tertiary qualification in a non-theological discipline and who wish to pursue a graduate qualification in theology and its associated disciplines, specifically those of Theology and Biblical Studies. Students will be able to critically engage Christian thought and traditions, enhance their professional works and give expression to insights for Christian living.

The Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies focuses on introducing students to two core theological disciplines (Theology and Biblical Studies) equipping them with foundational knowledge for further study in these two areas.

Knowledge

Graduates will have:

• an advanced understanding, within a coherent body of knowledge, specifically in the two core disciplines of Theology and Biblical Studies; this may include the acquisition and application of knowledge and skills in a new or existing discipline or professional area

Skills

Graduates will have cognitive and technical skills specifically in Theology and Biblical Studies, so as to be able independently to:

- review, reflect on, and synthesize theological information and identify and provide resources towards complex problems
- think critically and evaluate complex ideas
- apply specialised and creative skills for Christian living and ministry
- research, analyse and communicate theologically related ideas to a variety of audiences

Applications of Knowledge and Skills

Graduates will have the ability to:

- make high level, independent and theologically informed judgements
- plan and evaluate activities and projects within a particular ministry setting
- identify ways that this body of knowledge relates to Christian living and/or ministry

ARTICULATION TO OTHER AWARDS

Students are eligible to articulate to the Master of Theological Studies (MThSt). In this case, they would graduate with the Graduate Diploma and commence the MThSt as a <u>new</u> course. An application for admission into a new course would be required.

Students are also eligible to <u>transfer</u> their credit from the Graduate Diploma into the Master of Divinity (MDiv) program. In this case, they would forego graduating with the Graduate Diploma and simply continue their studies within <u>another</u> course. An application for admission into a new course would <u>not</u> be required. A written request to the Registrar to transfer from one course to another course would suffice.

ADMISSION TO CANDIDATURE

- 1. An applicant for admission to candidature for a degree of Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies will:
 - (a) have qualified for admission to a three-year AQF Level 7 award from an accredited Australian tertiary institution; or
 - (b) hold, from a university or other tertiary institution, qualifications approved by the Student Support and Administration Committee as equivalent to such an award
- 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of this regulation the Student Support and Administration Committee of the Australian University College of Divinity may require an applicant to demonstrate fitness for admission as a candidate for this degree by carrying out such work and/or sitting for such examinations as the Student Support and Administration Committee may determine.
- 3. In exceptional cases an applicant may be admitted as a candidate for a Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies if the applicant submits evidence of other academic and professional attainments to the Student Support and Administration Committee of the Australian University College of Divinity.
- 4. A candidate for a Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies shall be designated as full time or part time. A student is designated as a full time if enrolled in three units (27 credit points) or more in a semester or part time if enrolled in less than three units (27 credit points) per semester.
- 5. No candidate for the award may be concurrently enrolled in any other undergraduate or postgraduate course within the Australian University College of Divinity or any other tertiary institution, unless approval has been granted by the Academic Board of the Australian University College of Divinity.
- 6. Applicants whose entry qualifications were obtained in an institution where English is not the language of instruction normally will be required to demonstrate competency in English by an IELTS (or equivalent) result of 7.0 in all bands of the test and may be required to attend such English language courses as prescribed by the Australian University College of Divinity.
- 7. Application for admission into the Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies program is made through the Registrar of St Andrew's.
- 8. Units in the 8100 series and 9200 series may be available to cross-institutional students, non-award students, and auditors after consultation with the Registrar.

COURSE STRUCTURE

- 1. The Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies requires the completion of 72 credit points (8 units).
- 2. Four units will be taken from the discipline of Biblical Studies (units coded 'B') and the sub-discipline of Systematic Theology (units coded 'T').
- 3. Students who enter the program from a BTh, BMin, MDiv or equivalent course cannot enrol in units with content similar to those covered in their earlier studies.
- 4. Each unit has a 9 credit point value unless otherwise stated.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES

In conversation with the Academic Director and Registrar, students may wish to also consider participating in the following additional extra-curricular opportunities which aim to complement their theological studies, but which may not be accredited for this course:

Please note that not all extra-curricular opportunities are available at all times. Whilst unaccredited, some of these activities are offered to current students with discounted, or no, additional fees.

PERIOD OF CANDIDATURE

- 1. The period of candidature for the degree shall normally be one year full time and two years part time, with a maximum period of up to four years if required.
- 2. In certain circumstances the Student Support and Administration Committee of the Australian University College of Divinity may grant extensions.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- 1. The Student Support and Administration Committee of the Australian University College of Divinity, at the recommendation of St Andrew's, may grant leave of absence from the Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies. The period of leave shall not be counted as part of the period of candidature for the degree.
- 2. The period of leave shall normally be one semester after which a candidate may apply for a further period of one semester or else be required to complete their candidature.

CREDIT FOR PREVIOUS STUDY

A candidate may seek credit up to a maximum of 36 credit points in the Graduate Diploma of Theological Studies. Credit may be granted only from units at graduate level where the outcomes, content, demand hours and assessment are equivalent to that of units in the Australian University College of Divinity award.

DELIVERY OF UNITS

- 1. Units are offered by weekly lectures on campus in Redfern during each semester. Please consult the Timetable page on the website.
- 2. Units are also offered via distance education (online) within the parameters of the two regular semesters.
- 3. Distance education is available either in real-time (through Zoom video conferencing) or asynchronously (by accessing video/audio recordings within 24hrs after the lecture).
- 4. Some distance education units normally include a compulsory on-campus residential component and all students studying via distance education must account for the need to travel to the Redfern campus on certain key dates throughout the year unless otherwise stipulated. TUITION FEES AND SCHOLARSHIPS

St Andrew's is committed to admitting the most able and dedicated students to its courses, regardless of their financial means or background. Most students are eligible for financial support as outlined below. Tuition fees have changed minimally since 2021.

A. Full Time Student Scholarship

The applicant will be (i) an Australian citizen; (ii) endorsed by a clergyman serving within the jurisdictions of local hierarchs who belong to the Episcopal Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of Oceania; and (iii) enrolled in 36 credit points during the semester.

B. Orthodox Christian Clergymen

The applicant will be (i) a clergyman serving within the jurisdictions of local hierarchs who belong to the Episcopal Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of Oceania; (ii) endorsed by their local bishop; and (iii) enrolled for 18 or 27 credit points during the semester.

C. Clergy Family Scholarship

The applicant will be (i) the wife or child of a clergyman noted above in [B]; (ii) endorsed by their local bishop; and (iii) enrolled for 18 or 27 credit points during the semester.

D. Greek Orthodox Archdiocese Scholarship

The applicant will be (i) an Australian citizen; (ii) an employee of a school, health care facility, or other organisation operating under the auspices of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of Australia; and (iii) enrolled for 18 or 27 credit points during the semester.

E. Church Volunteer Scholarship

The applicant will (i) be a volunteer in a parish within the jurisdictions of local hierarchs who belong to the Episcopal Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of Oceania (e.g., Parish Committee, Ladies Auxiliary, Chaplaincy Volunteers, Chanters, Scripture Teachers, Sunday School Teachers); (ii) present a reference letter from their parish priest; and (iii) be enrolled for 18 or 27 credit points during the semester.

A student's scholarship eligibility is reviewed each semester or annually. Scholarship provisions are subject to change from year to year.
